The Youth Heart Watch Program at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and Daniel E. Rumph II Foundation are offering a heart-screening program for children and adolescents ages 5-22 years. This program will screen for the presence of heart abnormalities at no cost to participants.

Why participate?

Healthy children may be at risk for developing an abnormal heart rhythm that could lead to sudden cardiac arrest (SCA), an event that causes the heart to suddenly stop beating. It is estimated that nearly 23,000 children each year in the United States have an arrest caused by abnormal or irregular heartbeats, a weak or thickened heart muscle, heart defects, or other rare conditions. Your participation in our heart health screening study will help us find the best way to identify children who are at risk for a SCA.
