





#### Vaux PATH Program



Joseph J. Peters Institute (JJPI)'s Partnership Addressing Trauma and Health (PATH) Program provides evidence-based trauma treatment in an outpatient program at the Philadelphia Housing Authority (PHA)'s Vaux Community Building. This unique integration of the work of PHA, other community-based PHA partners, and mental health trauma treatment services through JJPI will substantially increase access to a continuum of high-quality care for neighborhood residents.

#### **Evidence-Based Trauma Therapy**

Our therapists are trained to help children and adults experiencing a range of emotional, behavioral, and social challenges. We use trauma-informed care, focused on a collaborative, hands-on approach to addressing patterns of thinking or behavior that are often at the root of a person's difficulties. Therapists begin with a comprehensive evaluation to understand how trauma is affecting each person. Then, we discuss treatment options and develop a treatment plan. Treatment will emphasize each person's strengths and ability to heal.

#### Our evidence-based treatments include:

#### Prolonged Exposure Therapy (PE)

A practice used with adolescent and adult survivors of trauma, which is designed to allow individuals to revisit traumatic event(s) at their own pace through a process that reduces the negative impact of traumatic memories, thoughts, and beliefs. As the traumatic memories begin to lose their emotional impact, individuals feel significantly reduced or eliminated suffering as they move forward in rebuilding their lives.

#### Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (CBT)

An evidence-based practice that helps address distortions in thinking by changing the patterns of thinking or behavior that are often the root cause of a person's difficulties. This ultimately changes the way the person feels and experiences the world, reduces symptoms of depression and anxiety and increases happiness and overall functioning. The treatment takes a collaborative, hands-on, practical approach to addressing problems.

#### Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT)

A treatment specifically developed for helping children and adolescents heal from trauma. TF-CBT builds on the strengths of the child and caregiver through counseling and learning, among other approaches, to reduce symptoms related to trauma.

#### **Clinical and Patient-Driven Evaluation**

We use several standard measures of clinical success to continually analyze our patient outcomes. Additionally, we recognize the critical importance of the relationship between each individual and their therapist; we engage participants in satisfaction surveys and incorporate feedback into our programs.
